TEXAS STATE LITERACY PLAN

TLI grantees work to accomplish the five grant goals through the implementation of the TSLP and the development of a comprehensive literacy plan known as the "Data-Informed Plan" (DIP).

There are three online tools that work together to support the implementation of the TSLP:

- The *Implementation Inventory* serves as a starting point for sites and schools to take stock of current practices and identify their strengths and challenges. The Implementation Inventory is completed by the Leadership Team at each site/campus. It provides implementation levels for each Action Step, along with Examples of Evidence and Resources.
- The Leadership Team at each site or campus completes the Inventory for each component and receives real time results in the form of a customized *Implementation Map*.
- Representatives from each site or campus who are members of the CBLT participate in the TSLP Online Course. The course is designed to help each campus and each Literacy Line understand, use and progress through Action Steps which will result in the development of an aligned, customized, comprehensive literacy program for each site/ campus and for the entire Literacy Line.



A Focus on Comprehension: Laying the Foundation

On Thursday, November 29, 2012, all TLI Teacher Specialists and a representative from each campus participated in two training modules which focus on comprehension. The modules, "Reading with Purpose" and "Think, Turn, Talk", were presented by Darcy Dycha, Twyla Vogler, and Holly Ramos, State Literacy Liaisons for the Texas Literacy Initiative from the University of Texas Health Science Center in Houston.

These two modules are the first of several that will address instructional routines which include basic scaffolds for all students in the district. So what are the benefits of implementing these routines and strategies in these modules across all age/grade levels and content areas?

- Improves the reading achievement of all students
- Provides teachers with a framework foundation for instruction to meet the ELAR TEKS & SLAR TEKS
- Impacts the quality of instruction while focusing on comprehension
- Provides consistent routines in which scaffolded opportunities are embedded to meet the needs of all learner
- Influences student achievement in all subject areas
